## Introduction

In 2000 the University of Texas at El Paso published the “Index to Microfilm MF 513, part I & II: Ciudad Juárez Municipal Archives” which reflected UTEP’s valuable role in the production of over one hundred rolls of microfilm from the Ciudad Juárez Municipal Archives. The original documents are currently housed in the Biblioteca Regional Arturo Tolentino in Ciudad Juárez. Although the Index they published facilitates the navigation of this large portion of documents, the detail included often is not specific enough to permit the researcher to assess whether these documents may contain useful genealogical information. A film is also available at UTEP in El Paso, Texas.

In 2017, Linda Tigges introduced us to a small portion of this collection covering the years 1758-1761 which were relevant to her research of New Mexican merchants of the colonial period. While studying this collection, we realized many of them contain various types of documents which may be useful to the genealogical community. These include business records, land records, last wills and testaments, some criminal cases, marriage documents, and others which span the Camino Real from Santa Fe to Mexico City. In addition to the names listed in the above documents, the ages of the individuals, their civil status, occupation, and places of residence are sometimes given.

The purpose of this finding aid is to provide genealogists and other researchers with the above-mentioned lists of individuals mentioned in microfilm rolls CJMA Part 2 Roll 6 Book 1 Year 1758, 1760, and 1761. Although this microfilm roll covers the period of 1758-1760, some documents contained in them are from earlier or later periods. This finding aid is not intended to cover every document in this extensive collection, but rather focuses on the following types of documents.

Although many of the microfilm images are clear and easy to read, one difficulty present in some images is that the right margin of numerous *verso* folios is not legible, likely due to the tightness with which these documents were bound and/or the process of scanning the pages for the microfilm. This does not often affect the various lists of individuals in this guide, but some documents may need to be examined in person at the Biblioteca Regional Arturo Tolentino.

Names have not been standardized and accent marks which are not in the original documents were not used, the user of this material may choose to do so. If there is doubt as to the information, the closest repository to view the film is at UTEP in El Paso, Texas.

The New Mexico Genealogical Society has worked and financially supported this project, which is being made available to all members and non-members to further their research.


